## Richard Beswick Joins Texas Life Science Foundation Board

Prior to joining Scott & White, Dr. Beswick served as Medical Director for Nephrology and Oncology with Roche Pharmaceuticals. At Roche, Dr. Beswick was in charge of development of novel nephrology and oncology agents for clinical trials from Phase I – IV. Previously, Dr. Beswick worked for Johnson and Johnson/Orthobiotech as New Business Manager, Manager for Clinical Affairs and as Associate Medical Director. Dr. Beswick has developed numerous protocols for academia and the pharmaceutical industry.

"He brings tremendous experience in cancer clinical trials and is a champion for expanding patient education and participation in trials." Born in Montego Bay, Jamaica, Dr. Beswick earned a Bachelor's in Biology from Morehouse College, Atlanta, Ga., Master's degree in Cardiovascular Physiology from Central Michigan University, Mt Pleasant, MI., a Master's in Business Administration from Rollins College in Florida and a Ph. D in Molecular Renal Physiology from The University of Michigan School of Medicine. Dr. Beswick trained with Janice Douglas and Jackson Wright at Case Western Reserve University in the area of Endocrinology and Receptor Kinetics with a focus on angiotensin receptor system in the kidneys of African American patients. Dr. Beswick also served as Assistant Research Professor in the Department of Medicine Division of Hypertension at Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine and The Cleveland Clinic.
